From the President... August 2019

Hello fellow AETA members. This will be the last newsletter before the 2019 show which begins in approximately thirty days. Yes, just 30 days to the greatest farm show in Henry County. An annual farm show spanning 58 years that attracts visitors from multiple states and foreign countries. A show that is completely managed by <u>volunteers</u> who are dedicated to the mission of the organization "To promote the collection, restoration, preservation and exhibition of gasoline and steam tractors, power driven farm machinery and other equipment of historical value as an agricultural and historical society."



There are several projects to finish prior to our annual event. A work day is scheduled for Saturday, August 24th from 8:30 – noon. September work days will be Monday the 9th thru Thursday the 12th leading up to the show plus the week following for cleanup. The new building is delivered and scheduled for completion of phase 1 on September 1st. The line shaft design and installation in the blacksmith building is ongoing.



The installation of the framework and cement pad for the addition of a permanent power unit in the saw mill was completed on August 10th. Placement of the power unit, fuel tank and hydraulic system remains to be done. The sorghum press is installed and hopes are high that there will be cane sorghum to press and cook (1 yr ahead of schedule) at the show. Many thanks go out to member and volunteer Lowell Gramling who spent countless hours on the saw mill and sugar cane equipment.

In the past, members have provided their own tractors to pull the people movers. This practice was stopped a few years ago due to some mechanically unsound tractors being used that presented a safety hazard to show attendees. The board is willing to revisit this and allow members to use their own tractor, but only after a safety inspection is conducted by a board

member or a designee of the board. Any one that is interested in providing a tractor should contact a board member for further details.

The Thresherman's dinner will be prepared and served by the Hillsdale United Methodist Women Saturday evening September 14th. Ticket information about the meal is posted later in this newsletter. Reservations can be made by sending a check to AETA. Mail order deadline is Monday, September 9th. Tickets will be available for purchase at the show office on Friday and Saturday during show hours.

There will be a pie auction on Saturday following the regular auction at 3:00 pm in front of the Red Barn. Donated pies are needed for this auction and need to be delivered to the Red Barn by 2:00 pm. on Saturday, September 14th. This event always has some fun and lively bidding.

Thinking ahead to 2020, There are 3 board seats up for election. If you or someone you know is interested, please inform me or one of the other directors so the name can be placed on the ballot.


Minneapolis Moline and related equipment is the feature for 2020. We need someone to serve as the feature coordinator, so please contact a director indicating your interest.





AETA July 2019

Board Meeting

The AETA Board meeting was held July 1, 2019, at Deb Jacobs home on the Spring Hill Blacktop, Geneseo, Illinois 61254 at 6:30 p.m.

President Phil Jordan called the meeting to order and Secretary Bob Delp recorded the action of the meeting.

The following directors were present, Phil Jordan (President), Chad Jacobs (Vice-President), Jim Gradert (Treasurer), Bob Delp (Secretary), Alex Samuelson, Al Swanson, Deb Jacobs, Leon Rathjen being all the directors except Kyle Jahn.

President Phil Jordan asked June Cole for her report on vendors and the plans for the Threshermen's dinner at the Fall Working Farm Show. She also reported on the vendors to be in the craft building.

President Phil Jordan asked Randy Goddard to report on the Fall Show book and the number of books to order for this show. Following discussion, it was suggested that we order the same number of books as last year (2400).

Secretary Bob Delp had provided each of the directors with a copy of the minutes of the June 2019 Board Meeting. Following discussion, a motion was made by Al Swanson and seconded by Leon Rathjen to approve the minutes as presented. Motion carried.

Treasurer Jim Gradert provided each director with a copy of the June 2019 treasurer's report. Following discussion, a motion was made by Leon Rathjen and seconded by Chad Jacobs to accept the treasurer's report as presented and approve the list of bills as presented. Motion carried.

President Phil Jordan received notice from Ed Mayhew that Steve's Meats will not be at the Fall Show this year and he is trying to find a new footendor to file that void. It was suggested that he contact Kelly Girls wood fired pizza. Ed also reviewed the latest requirements for the Henry County Health Dept. Permits for food vendors at this year's Fall Working Farm Show.

President Phil Jordan presented information in regards to a request from Paul McCracken to use the show grounds and Barn for a family gathering on July 20, 2019. Following discussion, a motion was made by Leon Rathjen and seconded by Jim Gradert to follow the Board approved policy for charges for the use of the Barn and complete a form and furnish prove of insurance if alcohol is to be served.

President Phil Jordan reported Ron Rahn would like to rent the barn on July 8, 2020. A copy of the AETA Rules and Use Permit was mailed to him

President Phil Jordan presented information in regards to the proposals for the new building on the east side of the Timber Frame Barn. A payment of one-third of the cost of the project was required upon ordering the building. He, (Treasurer) Jim Gradert and (Secretary) Bob Delp will meet with Mark Mosbarger, Vice President, Senior Loan Officer at the Central Trust Bank to complete the financing for the new building.

Al Swanson reported on the updated asset list which he has been working on.

President Phil Jordan reported on meeting with Larry Colo to look at Allen Ernst sheep to pick out four lambs for the Fall Working Farm Show.

President Phil Jordan asked Al Swanson (Membership Chairman) to report on the status of paid memberships. He reported 108 life members and 229 paid memberships for a total of 337 members as of July 1, 2019.

President Phil Jordan asked (Vice President) Chad Jacobs to report on the farm operations. He reported that the soybeans had been sprayed on May 27th.

President Phil Jordan reported on the committee reports. Christmas at the Barn is scheduled for December 7th. Leon requested that the sign be updated for the HWY after the Craft Show to promote the Soup Supper. Phil and Tom Hintzhusen are to meet with Orville McCord on items to be donated to the club and the number of crop acres for the next year.

President Phil Jordan reported on the building project and plans to move fill dirt on July 6th.

President Phil Jordan reported on the show buttons and exhibitor plaques, he also discussed items for the goodie bags. Deb Jacobs reported on goodie bag items and cost. Following discussion, a motion was made by Leon Rathjen and seconded by Alex Samuelson to order 300 cork cup coasters and 300 letter openers, Motion carried.

President Phil Jordan reported on the request for information for the Mecum Commercial.

President Phil Jordan reported on the modifications to the Blacksmith Shop and the Sawmill.

Leon Rathjen discussed the installation of white ribbon wire along the fence by the visitors gate and along the fence by the loading dock.

President Phil Jordan reported on the installation of the sorghum press.

President Phil Jordan discussed the issue of the people movers and the need for a safety meeting and training for the people mover drivers at the Fall Working Farm Show.

President Phil Jordan reported on the harvest of the wheat projected for July 13^{th.} The next work day is scheduled for July 27th at 8:00 a.m. The next Board meeting is scheduled for August 5th, 6:30 p.m. at the Timber Frame Barn.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, President Phil Jordan declared the meeting adjourned at 9:20 p.m.
