ANTIQUE ENGINE AND TRACTOR ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED CONSTITUTION

I. NAME

The name of the organization association will shall be known as Antique Engine & Tractor Association Incorporated.

II. PURPOSE

- A. To promote the collection, restoration, preservation and exhibition of gasoline and oil engines, gasoline and steam tractors, power driven farm machinery and other equipment of historical value as an agricultural, educational and historical society.
- B. To promote wholesome recreation and to cooperate with other social agencies for the promoting community improvement, education and to encourage preservation of all types of agriculturally related antiques and artifacts.

III. MEMBERSHIP CLASSES AND DUES

Family membership will include head of household, spouse and children under18 years of age.

Individual membership will include members 16 years of age to 74 years of age.

Senior membership will include members age 75 and older after September 20, 2021.

Lifetime members will include members 75 and older on or before September 20, 2021.

Dues for each membership class will be published annually and reviewed/adjusted by the board as needed.

- A. Membership dues shall be reviewed and adjusted by the board as needed. Membership will include head of household, spouse and children under 18. Members are allowed 1 (one) vote per membership. eard.
- B. All eard holding members 16 years and over may vote.
- C. A member will have life membership after 75 years of age.

IV. OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES

Officers shall will consist of: President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer.

The officers will be elected annually by the Board of Directors.

- C. Committees shall will be appointed by the president or presiding officer Officers and may consist of any member. or interested individuals.
- D. There shall will be an executive committee, with executive powers only, which shall eonsist consisting of the officers of the eorporation association.

V.VI AMENDMENTS

An amendment to this constitution may be introduced at any time, but must require a 2/3 majority vote of the members present.

VI._{IV}. DIRECTORS

A, A Board of Directors shall board of directors will consist of nine (9) 9 (nine) D directors. The d Directors shall will each serve staggered terms consisting of 3 (three) three (3) years. Three (3) 3 (three) D directors will be elected by the membership each year to 3 (three) three (3) year terms.

- B. The Officers shall will be elected annually by the Board of Directors. (Move to IV. B) The president should serve at least 1 (one) one (1) year as a dDirector before being elected to office.
- C. Director vacancies within a normal $_{\text{three}}$ (3) year term will be filled by an association member appointed by the board $_{\text{to complete the term.}}$
- D. The retiring pPresident, if not seeking reelection to the bBoard of dDirectors, shall will serve as an ex-officio non-voting member of the board for a period of one (1) year following his/her term expiration.

BY LAWS

I. RULES OF ORDER

"Roberts Rules of Order" shall will be the authority on all rules of procedure not specifically stated in the constitution and by-laws.

II. DUTIES AND TERMS OF OFFICERS

- A. Directors shall will be elected at the annual meeting.
- B. In case of an officer vacancy vacancy of office, it shall will be filled by the an appointment election of from the b Board of Directors.
- C. The President shall will preside at all meetings of the members and of the bBoard of directors.
- D. The vVice-pPresident shall will assume all duties of the pPresident upon the absence or resignation of the pPresident.
- E. The Secretary shall will keep a record of all meetings of the corporation and the Executive cCommittee, and shall will prepare and keep a file of all members and committees.
- F. The Treasurer shall will sign all checks, vouchers and orders for payment as authorized. He/she shall will have charge of all funds of the corporation and shall will deposit them in a bank or shall disperse them as authorized by the other Officers. The President and Secretary shall will also be authorized to sign checks when as needed.
- G. A membership chairman will be elected by the board with duties to maintain an accurate membership roster of the total membership and categorized by family, individual, life and senior memberships. He/she will reconcile membership dues with the treasurer so all dues are recorded and accounted for
- H. G. The board shall will have the authority to hire an outside accounting firm as needed.

III. MEETINGS

- A. General membership meetings shall may be called by the Ppresident on approximately a monthly basis.
- B. Special meetings shall $_{\text{will}}$ be held at any time $_{\text{by}}$ the written request of 10% of the $_{\text{paid}}$ membership.

- C. Board meetings shall will be called by the President on approximately a monthly basis.
- D. Failure to hold a general membership meeting will not constitute a forfeiture or dissolution of the corporation.

IV. QUORUM

A quorum for all meetings of the officers shall will consist of a majority of the O officers elected officers in charge.

- B. A quorum for meetings of all committees shall will consist of a majority of the committee members.
- C. A quorum for the board of Directors shall will consist of a majority of the Directors.

V. PAYMENTS OF CLAIMS AND AUTHORIZING OF WORK

All expenditures of from all committees or individuals must be approved by the majority of the hoard of directors officers before any material or labor is contracted for.

VI. REMOVAL OF OFFICERS

Any officer or dDirector may be removed for a cause at any time.

Any of the following may be an acceptable cause, such as gross lack of attendance at board meetings, meaning more than 3 consecutive board meetings without notifying one a member of the Executive Board Members and/or failure to follow through with general responsibilities. may result in removal from the board by at least a 2/3 board vote.

Removal from the board requires a 2/3 majority vote of the board members.

VII. RULES GOVERNING SHOW

The Officers shall will, from time to time, make necessary rules concerning the show, exhibits and displays.

VIII. EMERGENCIES

By a 2/3 majority vote, The Officers may waive the rules and vote to pay for any claims against the Corporation.

IX. DISPLAY AREAS

All displays of running engines and other operating displays shall will be roped off at a safe distance. No person(s) other than the owner(s) or operator(s) shall will be permitted in this area display areas without the explicit permission of the said owner(s) or operator(s).

X. NOMINATING COMMITTEE

It shall will be the duty of the board of dDirectors of the Antique Engine and Tractor Association to appoint three (3) current members of the association to serve on the Nominating Committee. No member of the Board of Directors may serve on the Nominating Committee with the exception that a retiring board member not seeking

reelection may be appointed to the nNominating committee. It shall will be the duty of the nNominating cCommittee to select one (1) or more candidate(s) for each board position to be filled by the election of for the bBoard of Directors at the December membership meeting.

XI. ADDITIONAL NOMINATIONS

Any fifteen (15) or more members acting together may make nominations by petition and the sSecretary shall post such nominations at the same place where the list of nominations made by the Nominating cCommittee is posted. Nominations made by petition must be received by the sSecretary of the bBoard of directors at least thirty (30) forty-five (45) calendar days prior to the date of the annual December membership meeting. held in December.

XII. ELECTIONS

If no nominating petitions are received before the due date, a voice vote or standing vote of the membership to elect the members selected by the Nominating Committee will complete the election with the current Secretary casting one vote for the slate as submitted by the Nominating Committee.


If one or more nominating petitions are received with the required number of member signatures and within the required time frame then a paper ballot will be prepared prior to the annual meeting. The ballot will indicate the selections of the Nominating Committee and those that have submitted petitions. Each member of the club present at the annual meeting will be given one ballot at the annual meeting in order to make their selections. Each ballot marked with three or fewer selections will be tabulated by the current Secretary and the results read to the membership by the current President.

Federal or state mandates preventing in person meetings.

If there is only one (1) candidate for each open board position then the President or presiding officer may declare the election by acclamation.

If there is greater than one (1) candidate for each open board position, an official ballot will be mailed to each member by USPS or e-mail with a 10-day response period. Ballots will be returned to the Secretary for verification and compilation. The results will be provided to the board of directors.

In the event that there is a tie vote among two candidates, the president will cast the last and final vote to break the tie.
